Performances were less about the stories themselves and more about the actors' abilities in singing, dancing, acting, and acrobatics. Even though it was originally women who performed Kabuki, it eventually became all men. Onnagata = male performers who perform female roles. They are regarded as artists for their believable performances.	Uses elaborate scenery, props, costumes, makeup, and special effects. The stage has a runway that goes from the back of the audience to the stage and it's called the Hanamichi or flower path. A traditional striped curtain is used. Strokes of the makeup follow the angles and veins of the face to make the face more expressive. Different colors denote different characters and emotions. Most characters share the white base.
