The word Noh translates to "skill" or "talent"		
Founded in the 14th century by Kan'ami and his son Zeami		
Developed from religious ceremonial dancing		
Considered the entertainment of the upper classes		
	Protagonist in the story is known as the Shite	
	Performers wear character- specific masks (like women and demons)	
	In addition to the performers (Shite), there are musicians (Hayashi) and chanters/singers (Jiutai) onstage during the performance	
	Instruments used include a flute and various drums (like the Taiko drum)
